





- The Claimant is applying to the High Court for an interim injunction to restrain acts of trespass by the Defendants on the campus and buildings of the Claimant.
- 3. The application is urgent for the reasons stated in the Witness Statement of John Duffy dated 25 March 2013. In summary, there is a substantial risk of public disturbance and of serious harm to persons and property as a result of the occupational trespass upon the University's campus and buildings.
- 4. It is appropriate to issue the possession claim in the same Court as the injunction application in order to avoid the duplication of costs and unnecessary use of resources in two different courts.

WITNESS STATEMENT OF JOHN LEO DUFFY

I, John Leo Duffy, of the University of Sussex, Falmer Hill, Falmer, Brighton, BN1 9RH will state as follows:-

- 1. I am the Registrar and Secretary of the University of Sussex ("the University") and am authorised to make this Witness Statement on behalf of the University in support of the University's application for an order for an injunction as set out in the Application Notice herein dated 25 March 2013 and an anticipated order for possession.
- Insofar as the facts and matters referred to herein are within my own knowledge, they are true and in so far as they not within my own direct knowledge they are true to the best of my information and belief, acquired in the course of acting in my capacity as the Registrar and Secretary of the University of Sussex.

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 I exhibit hereto a bundle of copy documentation and correspondence, to which I shall refer in the course of the Witness Statement, marked "JLD1".

The University

4. The University was established in the 1960's and has a global reputation. We have numerous students taking undergraduate and postgraduate degree programmes.

The Campus

- 5. The University's campus covers a large area at Falmer outside Brighton. I shall refer to the campus throughout this Witness Statement as "the Campus". General maps of the Campus are at pages 1 and 2 of Exhibit "JLD1".
- The University's leasehold title to the Campus is registered at HM Land Registry under title numbers SX110974 and SX110975.
- 7. True Official Copies of the University's registered title with filed plans are exhibited to this Witness Statement marked pages 3 11 of exhibit "JLD1". A copy of the lease referred to in the Official Copies is exhibited to this Witness Statement marked pages 12 20 of exhibit "JLD1".
- As the Campus is private land, only persons with the licence or consent of the University may enter or remain on the Campus.

The Students at the University

9. The University places a high value on providing its students with a fulfilling education in their chosen discipline. There are a wide range of activities on the Campus and the Campus environment is the focal point for the lives of students attending the University. We therefore seek to ensure that our students have the right environment on the Campus to enable them to settle in and study effectively in a safe environment.

The Protest

10. In May 2012, the University announced its plans to work with external partners to deliver catering and certain facilities management services on the Campus. Following a campaign against this proposed outsourcing of 235 jobs at the University (which included meetings and minor demonstrations on the Campus which were tolerated by the University), a large group of people (approximately 300) took up occupation in the conference centre on the top floor of Bramber House after storming the main staircase

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(Bramber House is shown edged red on the Campus maps at pages 1 and 2 of Exhibit "JLD1").

- The occupation has continued for over 6 weeks and has posted the following demands on their website http://sussexagainstprivatization.wordpress.com (at pages 21 – 24 of Exhibit "JLD1")
- 11.1 A complete halting of the ongoing bidding process and end to the entire privatization program, effective immediately.
- A commission of students, staff and lecturers to be formed with full remit to re-evaluate procedures and channels for holding management accountable as well as reviewing and extending student and workers' say in these decisions.
- An end to the intimidation that senior and middle management have used to deter students and workers for airing and acting on their concerns.
- 12. The protesters note in their bulletin (at pages 26 27 of Exhibit "JLD1") that 'every day that [Bramber House] is occupied puts direct financial pressure on management to end the privatisation process.'
- 13. The University has over the last few weeks engaged in dialogue with those occupying Bramber House in an attempt to reason with the students and understand their concerns. On 12 March 2013, the Vice Chancellor of the University formally responded to the protesters offering a meeting on the condition that the protesters leave Bramber House. The protesters refused the meeting and refused to vacate.
- 14. Whilst it has been made clear to the occupiers that the 'sit in' being conducted is unacceptable, the University has to date tolerated the protest as an isolated incident and one which can be contained without undue disruption to the day to day operation of the University. The occupation has, to date, for the most part been peaceful, with Bramber House being used as an open social space for working groups, music sessions and film screenings. There have been acts of petty vandalism and breach of the University's health and safety policy.
- 15. Matters on the Campus have escalated significantly in the last week, however, since arrangements started to be made for a national demonstration to take place on the Campus, today, 25 March 2013.

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- 16. The proposed demonstration which was arranged without any liaison with the University or the local police (and is without a dedicated organiser to allow liaison going forward), was set up as an event on Facebook and according to this over 14,000 people have been invited. Social media videos and posters (a selection of which are at 28 44 of Exhibit "JLD1") are being used to encourage students from London to come to Sussex to join the protest.
- 17. Free coaches are being run to enable a nationwide participation in what the protesters are clearly hoping will be a mass protest. At the time of preparation of this witness statement, several hundred protesters have descended on the Campus and many more are expected.
- The protest which is taking place on the Campus is no longer peaceful and is now far 18. too large to be tolerable to the University going forward. The protesters continue to occupy Bramber House but I am advised by my security team are no longer complying with health and safety requirements. Property damage is being caused as a result of protesters in Bramber House breaking down doors and accessing unauthorised areas such as kitchen areas which they are using for accommodation and cooking. Protesters are now also occupying the roof of Sussex House (one of the key management buildings of the University housing the University's main management staff including the Vice Chancellor and other administrative functions including finance). They are setting off flares, have forcibly entered Sussex House damaging property to do so (kicking down doors and breaking windows), and confidential documents are being ransacked and burned outside the building. Some buildings have been graffitied and recently some locks at Sussex House have been stuck with superglue. A number of cafes on the Campus have been occupied too. Photographs and extracts from Twitter and other blogs are at pages 45 - 126 of Exhibit "JLD1"

The Injunction/Possession Order Sought

- The protestors have no right to conduct a 'sit-in' or encourage mass protest as they are doing. This taking of occupation upon University property is a trespass which extends well beyond the terms on which students are entitled to access upon University property.
- 20. Furthermore, the University's Ordinance on Student Discipline (see pages 127 136 of Exhibit "JLD1") ("the Ordinance") forms part of the student contract on the part of each student of the University. In particular:-

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- 21. Paragraph 2(1) of the Ordinance states that "Students shall maintain a standard of conduct which is not harmful to the work, good order or good name of the University."
- 22. Paragraph 3 of the Ordinance includes as examples of breaches of discipline as:-
 - 22.1.1 Paragraph 3(2)(a) Conduct injurious to the academic or administrative activities of the University (e.g. disruption of teaching, of research, of examinations, of the working of staff)
 - 22.1.2 Paragraph 3(2)(e) Riotous or disorderly conduct (whether or not causing damage) within the University or conduct within or without the University seriously affecting good order within the University.
- 23. Paragraph 3(2) of the Ordinance makes it clear too that the listed examples of breaches of discipline are illustrative only and shall in no way prevent the University from considering and adjudicating upon any other conduct which shall be referred to as an alleged breach of discipline.
- 24. There is a serious risk to health and safety as a result of the unauthorised occupation of the Campus by the protestors. As others are being encouraged from various sources to join the protest, this situation has got worse. There is a real concern that 'professional protesters' who have no interest in the issues which are the subject of the protest but wish to gain access to the Campus and create disruption will also join the protest. Attempts by non-students to join the protestors causes concern not only for the welfare of the general student community but also for the protestors themselves.
- 25. As a result of the protests, the University has had to close numerous seminar rooms in Bramber House disrupting the education of hundreds of its students. Staff have had to be relocated from various buildings across campus for their safety and security. The disruption being caused to Sussex House is exceptionally problematic given its status as the 'engine room' of the University. Visits to Campus by potential students from the local UCAS fair have been cancelled. This avoids health & safety issues but affects the reputation of the University. Finally, huge expense has been incurred in significantly boosting the security presence on key buildings and following advice from local police (also involved in bringing order to the Campus) hiring extra external security guards.
- 26. In summary, the University has a responsibility for the safe and orderly running of the Campus, to thousands of students and staff on the Campus and to hundreds of visitors to the Campus. The purpose of the University is to provide higher education to students. At present this is being affected by the protest. The University is concerned that further disruption of its teaching programs will affect the student community.

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- 27. In the light of the situation which I have described I respectfully ask on behalf of the University for an injunction in the terms of the draft Injunction attached to the Application Notice dated 25 March 2013.
- 28. I also make this witness statement in anticipation of asking the Court to grant a summary order for possession pursuant to CPR Part 55.
- 29. With respect to the possession order, I will respectfully be requesting the Court to grant such an order to cover the entirety of the Campus. If the Defendants are forced to move from one part of the Campus only, then it is highly likely that this will only result in them moving to another part of the Campus.

Undertaking in damages

30. I am able to confirm to the Court that the University is aware of the requirement for a cross-undertaking in damages and that the University is able and willing to provide such an undertaking.

Service

31. With respect to service, I request an order pursuant to Rules 6.15 and 55.6 of the Civil Procedure Rules that the affixing in conspicuous places around the Occupied Area of copies of the Claim Form, the Order and this Witness Statement (and exhibits), shall be good and sufficient service.

Sussex Against Privatization

STOP THE OUTSOURCING OF 235 JOBS AT SUSSEX UNIVERSITY This blog has been set up by workers at Sussex University who are opposed to the plan to privatize 235 jobs announced in May 2012. This is a place to discuss how we can stop it.

The Occupation – Ongoing Since Thursday 7 February 2013

Following a demonstration of over 300 staff and students in opposition to the privatisation of services at Sussex University; a large group of people have occupied the conference centre on the top floor of Bramber House.

In May 2012, the University announced its unilateral decision to sell off most services provided on campus, over 10% of its workforce, to private investors. This announcement came with no student consultation, and next to no consultation with the 235 workers and trade-unions concerned. In the months since, management has failed to offer anymore than a series of "negotiations" and piecemeal Q&A sessions, which only occurred after repeated requests by students and staff, and the conclusions of which it repeatedly proceeded to ignore. The biggest effort from management to secure outside approval was in the form of a report from 3 undisclosed members of Council/Senate, which cannot be expected to represent the interests and variety of opinion of the wider community.

Before we detail our demands we would like to express that the occupation of the conference centre comes as a last recourse for action in order to ensure that student and staff voices are heard. Sussex University Management has made it clear that it is not interested in the views expressed by thousands of its students, staff and lecturers. This occupation comes after every negotiation table, public meeting, demonstration, motion and petition failed to spur management to halt the bidding process. We would like to iterate that this occupation was entirely peaceful from the onset. The attendees and speakers completed their conference as timetabled. The delegates also gave the students a platform to speak about the campaign at Sussex and endorsed both our cause and method.

We stand in opposition to the attempts by university management to unilaterally impose a highly unpopular wave of privatisations which will see provision of services handed over to the highest bidder. As well as a colossal transfer of wealth from the public to the private sector, privatisation has time and time again been shown to negatively impact on employees and service users. Our Vice Chancellor, Michael Farthing himself dabbled in a similar escapade to privatise services at St. George's medical college, it failed miserably and had to brought back in house. In the past, all surplus generated from the provision of these services has been reinvested in the University's facilities – Sussex stands to see that surplus extracted by private companies and financiers if these plans go ahead. For the 235 workers affected (see list here) this will mean reduced job security, the handing of control over pensions to private companies and the deterioration of pay terms and working hours and

conditions. A recent<u>review in the guardian</u> of how outsourcing fails to deliver and betrays the public sector vindicates our concerns.

Perhaps most importantly the decision to bring private providers into the education sector reflects a larger ideological push by this and previous governments to marketise education as a consumer good. For management at Sussex this is certainly a continuation of departmental teaching and university-wide job cuts over the past 5 years under the guise of "deficit-cutting". We stand firmly against the segregation of our campuses along producer/consumer lines and reject this false dichotomy. Moreover, we reject the way in which outsourcing further segregates different members of the campus community, whose job statuses, though necessarily complementary in practice, become suddenly dissociated financially and institutionally, leading to a complete breakdown of the social cohesion intrinsic to any healthy and normally functioning organisation. We wholly reject the undemocratic and unaccountable structures and procedures which this management has procured in order to force its agenda on members of the Sussex campus community. We reassert that Education is a public good that is and should remain free of perverse market incentives in every aspect of its provision.

We Demand:

1. A complete halting of the ongoing bidding process and end to the entire privatization program, effective immediately.

2. A commission of students, staff and lecturers to be formed. With full remit to re-evaluate procedures and channels for holding management accountable as well as reviewing and extending student and workers' say in these decisions.

3. An end to the intimidation that senior and middle management have used to deter students and workers for airing and acting on their concerns.

Why? Top Six Problems With Outsourcing

1. Loss Of Managerial Control

Whether you sign a contract to have another company take over an entire department or single task, you are turning the management and control of that function over to that company. True, you will have a contract, but the managerial control will not be yours. Your outsourcing company will not be driven by the same standards and mission that drives your company. They will be driven to make a profit from the services that they are providing to you and other businesses like yours.

2. Hidden Costs

You will sign a contract with the outsourcing company that will cover the details of the

service that they will be providing. Anything not covered in the contract will be the basis for you to pay additional charges. Additionally, you will experience legal fees to retain a lawyer to review the contacts you will sign. Remember, this is the outsourcing company's business. They have done this before and they are the ones that write the contract. Therefore, you will be at a disadvantage when negotiations start.

3. Threat to Security and Confidentiality

The life-blood of any business is the information that keeps it running. If you have payroll, medical records or any other confidential information that will be transmitted to the outsourcing company, there is a risk that the confidentiality may be compromised. If the outsourced function involves sharing proprietary company data or knowledge (e.g. product drawings, formulas, etc.), this must be taken into account. Evaluate the outsourcing company carefully to make sure your data is protected and the contract has a penalty clause if an incident occurs.

4. Quality Problems

The outsourcing company will be motivated by profit. Since the contract will fix the price, the only way for them to increase profit will be to decrease expenses. As long as they meet the conditions of the contract, you will pay. In addition, you will lose the ability to rapidly respond to changes in the business environment. The contract will be very specific and you will pay extra for changes.

5. Tied to the Financial Well-Being of Another Company

Since you will be turning over part of the operations of your business to another company, you will now be tied to the financial well-being of that company. It wouldn't be the first time that an outsourcing company could go bankrupt and leave you holding-the-bag.

6. Bad Publicity and III-Will

The word "outsourcing" brings to mind different things to different people. If your friends and neighbors lost their jobs because they were shipped across the state, across the country or across the world, outsourcing will bring bad publicity. If you outsource part of your operations, morale may suffer in the remaining work force.

Conference Centre under new management



On the 7th of February, Bramber House Conference Centre, the very room where outsourcing was announced to campus workers (without their consultation) in May last year, was occupied by students in opposition to the privatisation process. The occupation began when students from a three hundred strong demonstration against privatisation stormed Bramber's main staircase. The occupiers plan to stay, despite anger and threats from Michael Farthing, until management meet the occupiers' demands.

Management called in private security and dog-handling units to watch entrances, denying access to the building. Generally though, relations with security have stayed positive, occupiers making tea for them on their long shifts and engaging them in discussion. Put effectively under siege, spirits nonetheless stayed high as buckets of pasta and other supplies were winched up to the balcony. Messages of solidarity were sent by student unions across the country, support staff, academics and others (including the likes of Frankie

Boyle and Noam Chomsky). On the morning of Tuesday the 12th, the first formal response from management was given in a letter from Michael Farthing who, ever so kindly, conceded that a meeting would be held to discuss privatisation - on the condition that all occupiers leave the Conference Centre. The occupiers graciously declined the offer, and that afternoon the largest demonstration yet stormed Bramber, leading to a large general assembly of students inside the Conference Centre discussing the issue and what course of action to take. The number of demonstrators involved forced a concession that access allowing access to and from of the occupation between 8am and 10pm.

The conference centre has since served as an open social space in which talks (from speakers such as Will Self and David Graeber), music sessions, spoken word, film screenings and much more have taken place. It is also a base for open working groups furthering the antiprivatisation campaign. Decisions in the occupation, unlike those forced upon us

by management, are taken collectively and democratically, and the room is kept as a safe space in which sexism, racism and ableism are not tolerated. All are invited to come up for a chat and to share a free cuppa or some communal food, or to join a meeting, contribute ideas for the space and get involved in the campaign.

Every day that the Conference Centre is occupied puts direct financial pressure on management to end the privatisation process. Management have thus far ignored petitions, student union motions and concerns raised time and time again at public meetings. They attack services and workers' conditions while enjoying six figure salaries themselves. Direct action remains the last resort and the only way we as a campus community can force them to listen to us.

On the 1st of November the management of the Nursery and Pre-school facilities on campus was transferred to the Cooperative Childcare group; the first move to be completed as part of the wider plans for outsourcing which will see a total of 235 jobs on campus privatised by summer 2013. Despite the fact that plans for the move had been in the pipe-line for many months, it wasn't until six-weeks before it was actually due to take place that members of university staff who use the facilities were informed that this move would mean the closure of the Sussex Flexible Childcare Scheme (SFCC). 
Reclaiming Our University

Fifteen thousand people live, work and study at Sussex University, and yet campus life can often feel very isolating. We are divided up into many different workplaces under separate, complex management structures with the result that many of us only know the few people we work with directly. Management keep tight control over our time, leaving us little opportunity to meet, organise amongst ourselves or even just get to know each other. For example, since the campaign against privatisation began, management have, sometimes at a moment's notice, changed the times cafe staff take their breaks in a deliberate attempt to prevent them from linking up with other people on campus.

Nevertheless, we are part of a community here, a community which is becoming stronger as we find new ways to support each other. By forging links with people from other workplaces we can start to feel less confined to the places we do our own work, and start to feel that the university belongs to us. And it's not just about getting to meetings or pickets; it's about any

It's about walking across campus and seeing a yellow square in a window and knowing that someone's on our side. 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
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Sussex University anti-outsourcing struggle escalates



The anti-privatisation campaign at the University of Sussex is gathering strength - and there are signs university management are feeling the pressure.

The student-led occupation of the Bramber House conference centre is now 6 weeks old. Monday, 25th March has been called as a national demonstration against the privatisation and marketisation of universities. At the time of writing, nearly 900 people are 'attending' the Facebook event, while free coaches are being laid on from London. In the build-up to Monday's mass demonstration, management have attempted to clamp down.

On Tuesday evening, private security hired by university management attempted to impose a checkpoint to conduct bag searches and student ID checks on the occupation. This led to an academic speaker being denied entrance. The occupiers, in line with their policy of "peaceful non-compliance" resisted. One occupier was grabbed by the neck and thrown to the floor, but student reinforcements arrived and security withdrew. The established arrangements of open access between 8am and 10pm were preserved.

On the same day, the university's senior communications officer sent an email to all schools claiming that a survey on altitudes to privatisation being conducted by student paper the Badger was in breach of university rules, and urging staff not to co-operate. This was understood by students as clear contempt for freedom of the press. It has also been reported that a student who wrote a letter of complaint to management has been fined £100. The fine was subsequently commuted to a mandatory seminar on the "ethical lines relating to the boundaries of 'fair comment' in polemical communications'. The student's offending remarks were reported to be suggesting that a manager's job title should be "director of corporate tyranny and human suffering".

These incidents follow threats to staff for attending campaign or union meetings, bans on wearing yellow badges in opposition to outsourcing, and management attempts to prevent union reps including campaign logos in their internal emails. These attacks on freedom of association, freedom of expression and freedom of the press fly in the face of the university's claims to welcome dissent and dialogue, and contravene rights supposedly guaranteed in the university statutes. The occupation responded by taking over the Bramber House kitchen, part of the lucrative catering bulsness which is facing outsourcing (see photo, top). Occupy Sussex tweeted:

Management attempted to restrict access, so tonight we have expanded the occupation. Escalation brings escalation. Bring on #Mar25

Meanwhile, academics and support staff from the departments of anthropology and international relations have written statements of support, while a local MP has tabled an early day motion in parliament. The national demonstration is scheduled for 1pm, Monday 25th March, Library Square, University of Sussex,


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Incensed at an *abusive email* from a student suggesting that Sussex University managers are ruthlessly focussed on making money, the said managers decided to fine the student £100.

However, following a successful campaign by Sussex Students' Union newspaper The Badger, the sentence has been commuted to 'attending a one-to-one seminar with an academic on the boundaries of 'fair comment' in polemical communications."

The controversy – in which someone emailed a Big Manager On Campus (BMOC) to suggest, "Perhaps an apt job title for you would be Director of Corporate Tyranny and Human Suffering," – came at the end of a week which saw a Palestinian court hand a man a one-year prison sentence for insulting Palestinian Authority president Mahmoud Abbas, and a European Court of Human Rights ruling which found that France had violated an activist's freedom of expression by fining him for showing an abusive placard to Nicolas Sarkozy.

Makes you proud to be British, doesn't it, that such restriction of free speech doesn't happen in our country. Well DON'T SPEAK TOO SOON, because it's time for:

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

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



On 25 March 2013 the University of Sussex will see a national demonstration against the marketisation and privatisation of Higher Education. This is a valuable opportunity to unify diverse local campaigns against privatisation and out-sourcing into a national movement. By using the day to bring together activists and campaigners from around the country the long-running Sussex campaign has the opportunity to act as a catalyst for an ongoing campaign of real strength and resilience by linking activists into a national network.

The University of Sussex has been in occupation now for 5 weeks. Since the plans to outsource 235 jobs at the University were announced in May 2012, a small and well organised campaign has sustained an opposition to these proposals. The occupation of Bramber House was an important step in escalating this opposition and its achievements over the last 5 weeks must be recognised. It galvanised the campaign, transforming it into a mass movement on campus. Regular protests, further occupations and the visual transformation of campus with yellow squares adorning windows and jackets have forcefully demonstrated to management the scale of opposition to their proposals and fostered a sense of solidarity and confidence amongst those who oppose outsourcing. High profile media coverage has put the issue of the marketisation of higher education back on the agenda and reinvigorated many of the movements that emerged from the student protests in 2010.

5 weeks on, however, we must think carefully about the future direction of the campaign. As the queer (in) crisis collective have pointed out here and here, a new equilibrium has been reached on campus. Not only does management appear content to tolerate the presence of the occupation, but it has actively co-opted it into its attempts market brand Sussex. On recent open days, Sussex sales persons have pointed out the occupation to potential customers, sorry students, and boasted how the tradition of radical Sussex remains alive and well. Through its absorption into the brand heritage, the oppositional potential that was embodied by the occupation at the outset is dissipated. Meanwhile, management show no sign of changing their plans and seem determined to steamroll the outsourcing through. Where then, might we go from here?

The demonstration against privatisation called by the National Campaign Against Fees and Cuts at Sussex University on 25 March 2013 represents an opportunity both to reinvigorate the national student movement and build a national campaign against privatisation. Perhaps we can use this event to learn about other modes of activism and successful anti-privatisation campaigns? In places like the London borough of Barnet, an alliance of workers, citizens, trade unionists and radical bloggers have built a successful grass-roots campaign to fight the privatisation of services under the Tory-led council's 'One Barnett' initiative which would see the outsourcing 70% of the council's services (worth £1Billion) to private providers. Through demonstrations, occupations, civil disobedience, squatting the local library, legal actions, the clever use of FOI requests the people of Barnet are building a campaign which will stop outsourcing. The whole outsourcing project is currently stalled, subject to judicial review in the Royal Courts of Justice. Even the embattled Higher Education Sector has had its success stories. Over ten months last year the local Unison branch at London Met successfully campaigned alongside UCU and the Student's Union to prevent the outsourcing of all non-academic staff by university management. In Brighton the Stop the Cuts coalition have been fighting on a range of fronts from outsourcing to anti-workfare campaigns and mobilisations against the bedroom tax. The 25th March demonstration represents an important opportunity to build alliances with these groups, to share expertise and to coordinate future actions targeting both the institutions which outsource and, more importantly those companies who enable it.

The 235 jobs under threat at Sussex represent a tiny proportion of the tens of thousands which will be outsourced across the country. Let's use the 25th of March to build on the success of the Sussex Occupation and set about creating a national campaign against privatisation. It has to be more than just a demonstration; it needs to set the platform for the next phase of the struggle. Retoxify, Rebel, Revolt!

This is the same John Duffy whose proposals to bring 'external partners' onto campus were advertised in a journal before staff were even informed. A textbook example of irony, so he's being educational at least. Mr Duffy has form for being a prize cunt. In 2010, he perjured himself in the High Court in order to obtain an injunction against a student occupation, falsely claiming he was being held hostage. Students compiled a dossier refuting his fabrications here.

At the request and with the concurrence of Senate and without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor under Statute V, Council pursuant to the powers in that behalf conferred on it by the Charter and Statutes by resolution makes the following Ordinance:

Ordinance II: Student Discipline

1. Definitions

In this Ordinance:

The University means the University of Sussex Council means the Council of the University Senate means the Senate of the University Head of School means the Head of School of one of the Schools of the University (including the Dean of BSMS) the Director of CCE and the Director of SLI or the Head of the relevant non-academic Unit (Director of IT Services, Librarian, Director of Residential, Sport and Trading Services, Head of Student Support and Experience). Other members of the University (e.g. the Director of the International Summer School) may appropriately undertake this role as part of specific duties and responsibilities from time to time. In all cases the term "Head of School" shall include the Head of School's nominee. The Students' Union means the University of Sussex Students' Union. Student means any postgraduate or undergraduate student of the University, whether of full-time, part-time, distance learning, Elected Officer (Full-Time), or in continuation status but excluding students in attendance at an affiliated institution, who will be subject to the regulations of the affiliated institution, and excluding students in attendance at the Brighton and Sussex Medical School, who will be subject to the Disciplinary Regulations of the University of Brighton. It applies to all the students referred to above who are recorded as being students of the University, Irrespective of whether they are actually registered. The Student Discipline Committee means the Student Discipline Committee appointed by Senate pursuant to paragraph 4 (1) of this Ordinance Registrar & Secretary means the Registrar & Secretary (or nominee). The Student Disciplinary Panel means the Student Disciplinary Panel established by Senate pursuant to paragraph 5 (1) of this Ordinance The Student Disciplinary Appeals Board means the standing committee appointed by Senate pursuant to paragraph 7 (1) of this Ordinance.

2. General Provisions

- Students shall maintain a standard of conduct which is not harmful to the work, good order or good name of the University.
- (2) Students shall be responsible for making themselves acquainted with all provisions affecting them contained in Articles of the Charter, the Statutes, the Ordinances and Regulations of the University, and in such other Codes of Practice, Handbooks, etc. as Senate and / or Council shall approve from time to time and shall at the time of first

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registration sign a Declaration that they will at all times comply with the same. A copy of this Ordinance (inter alia [among other things]) is available on the University website.

- (3) The Ordinance applies both during term-time and vacation and during any periods of intermission.
- (4) Amendments or additions to this Ordinance by Council shall (unless otherwise stipulated by Council) be of immediate effect.
- (5) All members and employees of the University should use all reasonable endeavours to prevent the occurrence or continuance of any breach of University discipline and should immediately report any such occurrence to the appropriate officer or officers of the University.

Breaches of Discipline

...

- (1) In all cases where a member or employee of the University observes or is reliably informed of conduct which in their opinion may constitute a breach of discipline they should report such conduct to the Registrar & Secretary, who shall in turn report such:
 - to the Student Discipline Committee unless they deem the report to be inappropriate for such reference (for example, because the matter may be dealt with under the Degree Regulations);
 - (ii) to the Vice-Chancellor, so that the Vice-Chancellor may consider whether to use their power under Statute V, independently of this Ordinance;
 - (iii) to the Head of Student Support and Experience where there are reasonable grounds to believe that the student who is alleged to have breached discipline may be suffering from a mental health difficulty and may be in need of referral to internal or external services. The Head of Student Support and Experience will also be notified when it is likely that an alleged breach of discipline may have had a detrimental effect on the well-being of other students who may themselves require access to University support services, including Counselling.
- (2) Examples of what would normally be regarded as breaches of discipline include:
 - (a) Conduct injurious to the academic or administrative activities of the University (e.g. disruption of teaching, of research, of examinations, of the working of staff);
 - (b) Falsification or misuse of University records, including Degree, Diploma, or Certificate parchments;

- False pretences or impersonation of others within or without the University, in connection with academic attainments or financial awards;
- (d) Conduct of a kind which may lead to or has led to conviction under the criminal law, provided that such conduct affects the interests of the University;
- (e) Riotous or disorderly conduct (whether or not causing damage) within the University or conduct within or without the University seriously affecting good order within the University.
- (f) Violent, threatening, intimidating, harassing or abusive conduct towards a member or employee of the University.
- (g) Violent, threatening, intimidating, harassing or abusive conduct towards any person where such conduct is seriously detrimental to the good order or good name of the University.

The above examples are illustrative only and shall not prevent the University from considering and adjudicating upon any other conduct which shall be referred to it as an alleged breach of discipline.

(3) Being under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not normally be accepted as a mitigating factor or an excuse and may be regarded as an aggravating feature.

Mental health difficulties of a long-term nature are not normally regarded as a mitigating factor in student discipline cases. Students who have a diagnosed mental health difficulty are normally expected to take all reasonable steps to ensure that their health is maintained whilst they are a student at Sussex including accessing University support, as agreed with them, and community health services. However, the University recognises that sudden and unexpected changes in mental health may have an adverse impact on an individual's behaviour and such cases will be referred to the Head of Student Support and Experience for further advice and consideration.

Student Discipline Committee

- (1) Senate shall appoint a Student Discipline Committee.
- (2) The composition of the Student Discipline Committee shall be determined by Senate and published yearly in the Organisation of the University document for the current year.
- (3) The functions of the Student Discipline Committee shall be:
 - (a) To decide, in accordance with sub-paragraph (4) of this clause, upon the instigation of disciplinary proceedings;

- (b) To receive from the Registrar & Secretary reports of action taken under the terms of this Ordinance;
- (c) To scrutinise all proposals for amendments and additions to this Ordinance and submit recommendations thereon to Senate.

The Committee may delegate to its Chair, in accordance with Statute XVI.3, powers to decide upon the instigation of disciplinary proceedings, including whether to refer the matter under Schedule A, as described below, or to a Student Disciplinary Panel, in the intervals between its meetings.

The Student Discipline Committee shall, after considering the report(s) on the alleged breach(es) of discipline and after such consultation as it sees fit, decide whether disciplinary proceedings under this Ordinance should be instigated. The Committee may refer the matter to the Student Disciplinary Panel, or, if it considers that the alleged breach(es) of discipline does (do) not justify a Student Disciplinary Panel, may refer the matter to the student's Head of School under Schedule A Breaches of Discipline. If the Committee refers a case to the Student Disciplinary Panel, the Committee shall instruct that the allegation of breach of discipline against the person(s) concerned be investigated by the Registrar and Secretary, so that relevant documentation can be presented to the Student Disciplinary Panel.

5. Student Disciplinary Panel: Constitution

- (1) The Student Disciplinary Panel shall consist of three members, namely a Chair, appointed by the Vice-Chancellor as Chair of Senate, normally from among the Pro-Vice-Chancellors, a member of teaching faculty, drawn from a pool of six members of teaching faculty appointed by the Vice-Chancellor as Chair of Senate for a three year period and a Elected Officer (Full-Time) of the Students' Union nominated by the President of the Students' Union and appointed by the Vice-Chancellor as Chair of Senate.
- (2) Meetings shall be held in closed session. The hearing shall be quorate and shall proceed if the Chair and member of teaching faculty are present.
- (3) Decisions of the Student Disciplinary Panel shall be reached by a simple majority vote of those members present and voting, with the Chair having a second and casting vote if necessary.
- (4) The Registrar & Secretary shall be the Secretary of the Student Disciplinary Panel and shall attend its meetings.

Student Disciplinary Panel: Procedures

- There shall be served on a student against whom the Student Discipline Committee has decided to instigate disciplinary proceedings, in accordance with Statute XXIII, a written summons from the Registrar & Secretary giving a brief specification of the charge and calling upon him or her with at least fifteen working days' notice to appear before the Student Disciplinary Panel.
- The general procedures of the Student Disciplinary Panel shall be approved by Student Discipline Committee. In exceptional circumstances the Student Disciplinary Panel may adopt such further procedures as are consistent with the procedures as it deems necessary for the discharge of its functions. In particular, the Student Disciplinary Panel, with the agreement of all members of the Panel, shall be entitled, prior or otherwise to the hearing, to vary the procedures in any way which it considers to be fair and shall so inform the student.
- (3) Any breach of discipline admitted by the student or found by the Student Disciplinary Panel to have been committed may be dealt with by the Student Disciplinary Panel in one or more of the following ways:
 - (a) the permanent expulsion of the student from the University;
 - the exclusion (for a specified period of time) of the student from academic or other privileges;
 - (c) the suspension (for a specified period of time) of the student from academic or other privileges;
 - (d) the payment by the student of a fine to the University;
 - (e) a requirement for the student to undertake community service or other work within the University;
 - (f) the warning of the student as to their future conduct;
 - (g) the binding over of the student to good behaviour against a surety;
 - (h) the making good, at the student's expense, in whole or part, of any damage caused by him or her whether alone or with others; in addition to, or instead of financial reparation, the Student Disciplinary Panel may order the student to make a written apology to any person or persons affected by the breach of discipline;
 - the administering by the Chair of the Student Disciplinary Panel of a reprimand to the student;

- (j) the decision of the Student Disciplinary Panel to take no further action in respect of the breach of discipline.
- (4) The Student Disciplinary Panel may, at its discretion, order that penalties (a), (b) and (c) shall be suspended against the student's future good behaviour for a period to be determined by the Panel. If no breach of discipline is committed during the period of suspension, the suspended penalty will not be brought into effect. If, however, there is a further breach, the Student Disciplinary Panel may impose an additional penalty for the subsequent breach as well as ordering that the suspended penalty be brought into effect.
- (5) If the student fails to comply in whole or in part with any order of the Student Disciplinary Panel, the Registrar & Secretary may refer that non-compliance back to the Student Disciplinary Panel for further consideration.

7. Student Disciplinary Appeals Board: Constitution

- (1) An appeal will be heard by a Student Disciplinary Appeals Board which shall consist of three independent members of Council (one of whom shall be Chair) drawn from a pool of six independent members of Council appointed by the Chair of Senate on the recommendation of the Chair of Council plus a Elected Officer (Full-Time) of the Students' Union nominated by the President of the Student's Union and appointed by the Chair of Senate (subject to that officer not having been previously involved in the case at any level).
- (2) The quorum for meetings of the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall be two independent members of Council. Any failure by the President of the Students' Union to nominate a member or of any member so appointed to serve on the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall not in any way invalidate its proceedings and the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall be deemed to be duly constituted. Meetings of the Board shall be held in closed session.
- (3) Decisions of the Disciplinary Appeals Board shall be reached by a simple majority vote of those members present and voting, with the Chair having a second and casting vote if necessary.
- (4) The Registrar & Secretary shall be Secretary of the Disciplinary Appeals Board and shall attend its meetings.

8. Procedure for Appeal from the Student Disciplinary Panel to the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board

(1) A student may, within seven working days of the communication in writing of the finding of and the penalty imposed by the Student Disciplinary Panel give written notice to the Registrar & Secretary of their wish to appeal to the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board whether against the finding of, or the penalty imposed by, the Student Disciplinary Panel. Any such notice should set out the grounds of such appeal. The Registrar & Secretary shall present the case with an appropriate commentary to a Pro-Vice-Chancellor (who did not Chair the Student Disciplinary Panel) appointed by the Vice-Chancellor to determine within seven working days whether the grounds of appeal submitted make an appropriate case for the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board to be convened to consider it.

The grounds for an admissible appeal against the finding of a Student Disciplinary Panel shall be one of the following:

- that there exists evidence of prejudice or of bias on the part of a member of the Student Disciplinary Panel;
- (b) that there existed evidence relating to circumstances affecting the outcome of the Student Disciplinary Panel which the Panel were not aware when their decision was taken and which could not have been reasonably presented to them;
- (c) there was a procedural irregularity which materially affected the outcome of the hearing before the Student Disciplinary Panel.

Where a student has admitted guilt and the appeal is against the penalty imposed by the Student Disciplinary Panel, the Registrar and Secretary will normally refer the case directly to the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board.

- Where a case has been determined that it should be heard by the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board the Registrar & Secretary shall call the student to a hearing with at least fifteen working days' notice and shall be supplied with a copy of the Minutes of the proceedings of the Student Disciplinary Panel. At the same time, the student shall be informed that they are entitled to be accompanied by one other person (who may speak on their behalf), and that, if they wish to be so accompanied they shall inform the Registrar & Secretary accordingly of the name of the person accompanying them at least five working days in advance of the time of the hearing and whether they intend to be present at the hearing.
- (3) In any case where the student informs the Registrar & Secretary, in accordance with sub-paragraph (2), that they will be accompanied by a legal adviser, the University shall have the right to be accompanied by a legal adviser.
- (4) The Student Disciplinary Appeals Board will invite either party to call or present additional evidence which it is satisfied could not have been made available to the Student Disciplinary Panel and which had it been available could have materially affected the outcome of the hearing of

the Student Disciplinary Panel. Such evidence must be sent to the Registrar and Secretary at least five working days in advance of the hearing who will furnish such information to the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board and to both parties. In such an event the other party may present further evidence at the hearing to meet any new or additional issues raised. The Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall only permit witnesses to be called if their testimony relates to any additional evidence referred to above. Any witnesses called under this sub-paragraph may be examined, cross-examined and re-examined.

- (5) At the hearing, the student will be the first party to address the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board.
- (6) The Chair may invite an individual (normally the Chair of the Student Disciplinary Panel which heard the original hearing) to respond on behalf of the University.
- (7) Both parties may be examined, cross-examined, and re-examined.
- (8) Both parties shall withdraw while the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board, accompanied only by its Secretary, considers the presented information.
- (9) Both parties will be invited to return to make any closing statements.
- (10) Both parties shall withdraw while the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board, accompanied only by its Secretary, considers is decision. The student will be invited to return to hear the decision.
- (11) The Student Disciplinary Appeals Board may:
 - (a) confirm, set aside or vary any finding of liability by the Student Disciplinary Panel;
 - (b) confirm, set aside, increase, decrease or otherwise vary any penalty imposed by the Student Disciplinary Panel.
- (12) In the case of rejection of an appeal against a finding of liability, the student may make a plea in mitigation of the penalty imposed; in doing so, they may call witnesses (who should be on standby for such an event).
- (13) The Chair may invite an individual (normally the Chair of the Student Disciplinary Panel which heard the original hearing) to respond on behalf of the University.
- (14) Both parties may be examined, cross-examined, and re-examined.

- (15) Both parties shall withdraw while the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board, accompanied only by its Secretary, considers the presented information.
- (16) Both parties will be invited to return to make any closing statements.
- (17) Both parties shall withdraw while the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board, accompanied only by its Secretary, considers is decision. The student will be invited to return to hear the decision.
- (18) The decision of the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board both as to finding and penalty shall be final and shall be communicated in writing to the student by the Registrar & Secretary.
- (19) In exceptional circumstances, the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board may adopt such further procedures as are consistent with the procedures mentioned in this Ordinance as it deems necessary for the discharge of its functions. In particular, the Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall be entitled to vary the procedures mentioned in this Ordinance in any way prior or otherwise to the hearing which it considers to be fair and shall so inform the student.
- (20) The Student Disciplinary Appeals Board shall be entitled at its discretion to adjourn or postpone a hearing.
- (21) In all cases the Registrar & Secretary shall keep a Minute of the proceedings.

9. Criminal Proceedings

The fact that criminal proceedings have been threatened or instituted against a student in respect of any conduct shall not preclude the University from instituting and/or continuing disciplinary proceedings against him or her provided such are thought necessary in the interests of the University. The Student Disciplinary Panel or the Disciplinary Appeals Board may nevertheless decide on the special facts of any particular case to adjourn further consideration of the disciplinary proceedings until criminal proceedings have been concluded.

Schedule A: Breaches of Discipline

The Student Discipline Committee is empowered to decide whether proceedings under the Ordinance should be instigated. In a case where the Committee considers that a breach of discipline may be involved which does not justify a hearing of the Student Disciplinary Panel, the matter should be referred by the Chair to the Student's Head of School. The matter may be referred, at the Chair's sole discretion, to the Head of the relevant non-academic unit (or nominee), in which case references below to "Head of School" shall include the head of unit (or nominee) (see definitions in paragraph 1, above).

- (2) A breach of discipline which is not deemed by the Student Discipline Committee to justify a hearing of the Student Disciplinary Panel, will be deemed a Schedule A breach and will be one for which the penalty would not require permanent or temporary exclusion of the Student from the University, nor any fine in excess of £200 (a figure which should be periodically reviewed by the Committee under delegated authority).
- (3) A Student accused of a Schedule A breach of discipline will be invited to appear before their Head of School and may be accompanied by a friend or colleague (but not a legal representative) to discuss the allegation. The Head of School will then consult such other people as they think fit and hear the views of any other witness or witnesses requested by the Student.
- (4) If,
 - (i) the student has been notified of the date and time of the meeting with the Head of School, and
 - (ii) there is a reasonable expectation that the invitation was received
 - (iii) the student then fails or declines to attend, without good reason

the Head of School shall proceed to consider the matter in accordance with this Ordinance, but in the student's absence and on the basis of the written evidence provided.

- (5) If on investigation the Head of School considers that the breach is of a more serious nature, they will refer it back to the Chair of the Student Discipline Committee for appropriate action.
- (6) The Head of School will decide upon a penalty, if any, which should normally include making good any damage caused by the Student. A written report of the decision will be made to the Chair of the Student Discipline Committee and a copy given to the Student.
- (7) In the case of a Student who wishes to appeal against the decision of their Head of School, the appeal should be lodged in writing within seven working days and will be heard by one of the Pro-Vice-Chancellors nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.
