Notes

This prayer was written in reaction to the first ever strike by the Criminal Bar Association. These dedicated public servants are deeply concerned about the record-breaking backlog of criminal cases – over 58,000 – which leads to victims and defendants alike being denied justice. Moreover, legal aid funding has dropped by 28% in the past decade. This will destroy the diversity of the bar by making a career as a barrister inaccessible to those from disadvantaged groups.
