

SERMON VA-EIRA: HAMAS AND MUSK - DEALING WITH THE DEVIL

- [1] Well, I don't know about you, but I cried a little when I saw the photos of the first three returned hostages being reunited with their mums. While my head warned me that three slivers of good news can't begin to wash away the 16 months of pure undiluted nightmare that has had Israel-Palestine in its grip, my heart was able to look at the footage of these three young women being released as an unabashed moment of joy and human connection.
- [2] Of course, the ethics of the deal that led to the release are a little murky. The reality is that doing 'deals' with Hamas a terrorist organisation which has perpetrated unspeakable evils against our, and its own, people feels icky. Granted, the ceasefire is fantastic news: it came far too late for far too many Palestinians, yet we can still give thanks that the present bout of bloodshed and destruction is drawing to a close. But the other concessions made to Hamas feel questionable: the very act of giving terrorists something that they ask for is intrinsically questionable.
- [3] Yet while this was a deal with the devil, sometimes we have to deal with the devil.
- **[4]** Earlier this morning, we readⁱⁱⁱ about God's instruction to Moses and Aaron that they liberate the Israelites from captivity (which sounds sadly familiar).
- **[5]** There's a rabbinic tradition^{iv} that God doesn't speak to humankind in places of uncleanness or iniquity, yet the instruction we read today

- was given in Egypt, a nation of idolaters and slavedrivers. How do we explain God's decision to speak out from within Egypt's borders?
- **[6]** The commentator Rav Zalman Sorotzkin explains that God only did so "when צורת ישראל, the suffering of the Israelites, made it necessary".
- [7] So it was <u>necessary</u>. There was no choice. The suffering of the Israelites made it essential for God to hold the Divine nose and transact holy business in an unholy environment.
- [8] And the same, surely, applies to the hostages and their present-day captivity: nobody wants to deal with the wicked and depraved Hamas, but the suffering of the Israelites and the imperative of liberating them made it necessary to do a deal with the devil.
- [9] On the subject of wickedness and depravity, though, we also need to talk about Elon Musk.
- [10] Following Musk's decision to give a Nazi salute^{vi} in front of the world's press, and then to jeer and sneer^{vii} when confronted about it, Jake Wallis Simons, the editor of *The Jewish Chronicle*, mocked those who were concerned, saying that our discomfort with Nazi symbolism was merely "weaponising the Holocaust". viii (Which is odd, because he's always been the first to condemn Nazi salutes from other parts of the political spectrum.) ix
- [11] Similarly, yet worse, the Anti-Defamation League, the ADL roughly America's equivalent of the CST, it exists to counter antisemitism in public life issued an extraordinary statement indulging Musk for his "awkward gesture in a moment of enthusiasm".*
- [12] These statements were blatant, shameful and un-Jewish acts of 'sucking up'. Musk did a Nazi salute. As the German newspaper^{xi} Die Zeit put it (and I'm sure I don't need to translate this): "Ein Hitlergruß

Jake Wallis Simons knows perfectly well that what Musk did was a Nazi salute. Why are they pretending otherwise? To ingratiate themselves with him, to curry favour, to touch the hem of his garment.

- **[13]** But unlike the Gaza situation both Gaza situations, the ancient one and the contemporary one there is no need or justification, in this case, to kiss a neo-Nazi's ring. He doesn't have any hostages. He doesn't have any Hebrew slaves. He is deserving of nothing but contempt and no countervailing considerations require us to hold our nose and cosy up to him.
- **[14]** Musk was on that platform in Washington DC representing a quasi-fascist regime which used its first seconds in office to undo vii years of work on trans rights and to release viii a coup-plotting militia including a man with an I'm-a-fan-of-Auschwitz T-shirt viv from prison. The ideology this regime stands for is repugnant to Jewish values and, indeed, to human values, and there can be no excuse for the Jewish establishment toadying to such a monstrosity.
- **[15]** It was necessary for Israel to negotiate with the malignant Hamas because of "the suffering of the Israelites". Families reunited was a concrete end goal that made it all worthwhile.
- [16] However, so long as America continues to be a democracy, which I appreciate is far from a given, there is no risk in Jewish leaders resisting the present administration and every reason for them to do so. Moses stood up to Pharaoh; the Jewish world must stand up to Trump. And as our cousins in the United States begin to reckon with what the next four years will mean for them some of my rabbinic colleagues are already helping families of trans congregants to make sure that their passports are up-to-date it is our duty to stand with them and support them.

[17] The smiles on the faces of Romi Gonen, Doron Steinbrecher and Emily Damari as they hugged their mums provided a moving illustration of just what human connection can mean. The power of that connection must be harnessed for the benefit of the weak, the vulnerable and the marginal, not squandered on smug and self-serving political relationships. True Jewish leadership doesn't mean seizing photo-ops with politicians: it means challenging and confronting them.^{xv}

[18] As the fantastic Bishop Mariann Budde said^{xvi} in her inauguration sermon, shortly before a Republican congressman called for her to be deported: "Our God teaches us that we are to be merciful to the stranger, for we were all once strangers." For no people is that more true than for Jews. And let us say, amen.
